The 'Man of the Match' was elected by UEFA's Technical Study Group and awarded by MasterCard, one of the official EURO 96 sponsors, who donated £40,000 to international charities on behalf of the match recipients, and the 18 players nominated for the All-Star Squad of the Tournament.
